## SPECIFICATIONS AS DOCUMENTATION

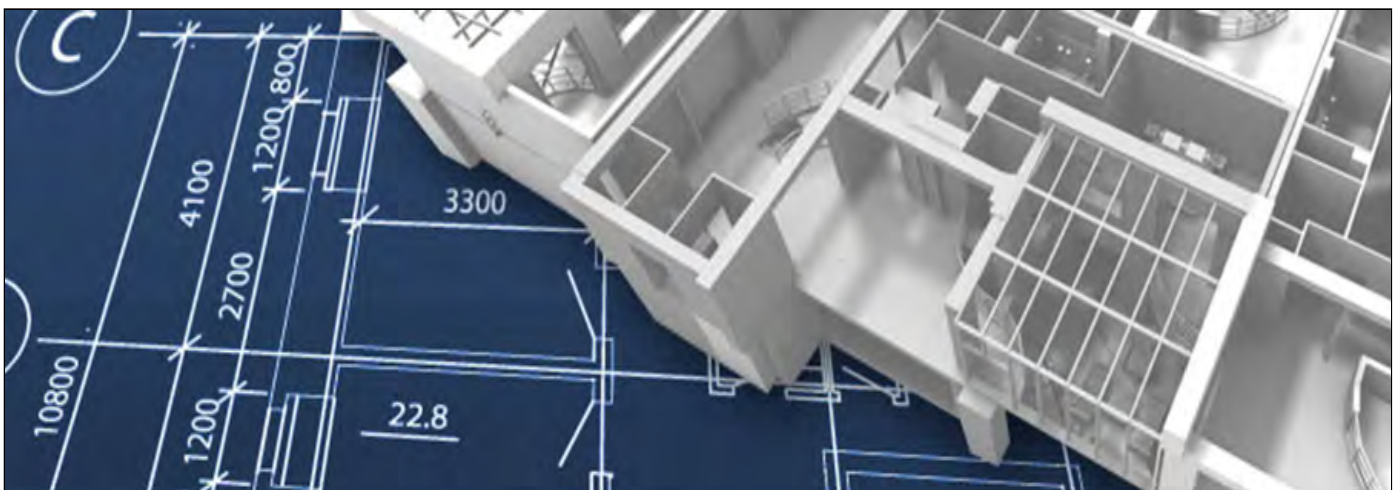
Since 1980, architectural specifications were produced using word processing programs; dozens or hundreds of copies were printed on paper and bound into project manuals for use in offices and construction sites. Prior to that mimeograph and Xerox machines were used with typed originals. Before that typewriters and carbon paper were used, and before that each typed page was run through a Diazo (blueprint) machine, making changes inconvenient for writers and difficult for distribution. Before CSI was formed in 1948, and building materials were much simpler and projects executed over longer time frames, specifications were written by hand, bound hardcopy like library books, on the Drawings or directed in the field by architects and master builders.



Those days are long gone and specifications are changing with the times again. Today building documentation is digital. Everything from product data sheets, to 2D slices out of 3D Building Information Models (BIM), and specification documents can be easily updated from central locations mere moments before a bid goes out or various work begins. Despite the best efforts of some amazing project teams, project delivery methods and increasingly fast track, complex construction is causing the industry to slip back into chaos again trying to control documentation. CSI, AIA, Lean Construction Institute and others need to work together to bring order back to design and construction processes.

Regardless of rapid changes, specifications still serve a unique role that requires repeatable, reliable organization, and legibility on devices as small as a smartphone. Standards and procedures long taken for granted need to be considered again. For example, William Pegues recently posted a reference on *4specs* Discussion Forum to an article titled "*Truth in Specifications*" (<http://bit.ly/1dAjlOk>) about the influence font selection has on perception whether written text is true. What else needs to be re-examined and discussed to keep specifications high quality, useful, and accessible across project teams? Since the cost of paper or weight of lugging around project manuals is no longer a concern, there is no reason to squeeze typography spacing inside words, between paragraphs, or on printed pages. Legibility, readability, and finding information is high priority. SectionFormat and PageFormat are more important than ever, not only for architects but for manufacturer guide specs. Can product data sheets and submittals be standardized? Are "BIMformat" and "SubmittalFormat" in the making? Can common performance properties be agreed upon for various materials and work results? Which steps can be automated and what needs to be decided by people? Could a manufacturer's installation video ever be linked to a BIM?

It is an exciting time for specifications as documentation and CSI has a critical role in determining what happens next. Participate in your chapter and join a committee to help push forward the parts of these current challenges that interest you the most. ❖



## UNOFFICIAL SUMMARY OF MAY 2015 BOARD MEETING MINUTES

- **Call to Order:** Luigi Grande, President of the NOVA Chapter, called the April 2015 regular meeting of the Board of Directors to order on Wednesday, May 13, 2015 at 5:09 pm at the Washington-Dulles Airport Marriott Hotel.
- **President's Report and Discussion Items:**
  - **Retired Members Status:** To avoid changes to our bylaws and associated coordination with Institute, the Finance Committee proposed the following regarding retired and emeritus members:
    - CSI members may become "retired" or "emeritus" members, who pay reduced dues to the Institute and Chapter. The reduced Institute dues rate for Retired members is \$35, and for Emeritus members is \$0. NOVA Chapter dues for Retired members is \$15 and for Emeritus members is \$0.
    - To be eligible to become a retired member, you must:
      - Be at least 65 years old.
      - Have been a continuous member of CSI for at least 5 years.
      - Have the endorsement of your current chapter president.
    - To be eligible to become an emeritus member, you must:
      - Be at least 70 years old.
      - Have been a continuous member of CSI for at least 15 years.
      - Have the endorsement of your current chapter president.
    - To provide an additional incentive for Retired and Emeritus members to attend monthly chapter dinner/meetings, a meal rate of \$35 will be assessed for those classes of membership beginning with the September 2015 dinner.
    - Diane Pittman moved acceptance of the recommendation, the motion was seconded and passed by the board.
    - Two applications for retired status have been properly completed, approved by the Chapter President and submitted to Institute for approval: Michael Montgomery and Luigi Grande.
  - **June Trade Show Meeting:** Mike Clancy reported that all fifteen vendor tables are sold for the event. Mike is working with the Marriott on the specifics for providing a wine bar for attendees. A flyer will be sent to local firms announcing the event and include information on registering staff to attend.
    - Those registered will receive vouchers or tickets for two glasses of wine from the bar. Additional drinks may be purchased at the open bar rates.
    - Bob Trafton has drafted and presented a tri-fold NOVA CSI handout that he expects to make available at the CSI registration table and also for distribution. Bob is soliciting input from the board members to complete the information.
  - **Cloning:** Luigi is handing this initiative over to Jesse as the incoming president. Jesse will determine if there is an ongoing need. Due to the recent elections, some previously proposed clone associations will need to be revisited.
  - **Double Our Membership Campaign:** Following board elections, the chair of the Membership Committee will be expected to change at the July meeting. Luigi expressed his willingness to serve on the 2016 committee. "New Member Coupons" will be provided by the Membership Committee Chair.
    - David requests assistance from our members that belong to other associations to encourage cross-advertising through their newsletters and websites.
  - **MARC 2018:**
    - David has received attendance input from previous MARC sponsor chapters, however, he has not yet had time to review or evaluate any of the suggestions provided.
    - **Treasurer's Report:** Diane Pittman submitted a financial report. See complete report on page 3 of this issue.
- **Committees**
  - **Programs:** Cynthia Heimann, Chair, is working with Deborah MacPherson on a September commitment provided by the Smithsonian.
    - Jesse needs tentative plans for next year's programs to include in the annual chapter report.
  - **Awards:** Bill Rains, Chair. Bill will be meeting with Luigi to propose awards for this year.
  - **Electronic Communications:** Jesse Oak, Chair, reported that some members are not getting email messages due to setting their preferences to deny receiving such communications.
    - An announcement will be included in NOVASpec and at the dinner for members to log into the CSI site and update their profiles.
  - **Adjournment:** There being no further business, President Grande declared the meeting adjourned at 6:00 pm. ❖

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## EDITOR'S JOURNAL - NEW CSI CERTIFICATION RENEWAL REQUIREMENTS - PART 1

I received an email notice in late May to renew my CCS Certification by the end of June. It expires every 3 years. In the past, a fee has to be paid and a statement made that I had completed the proper number of Continuing Education Credits. Since my Certification began in 1985, I had forgotten how many credits were required. However, attendance at every annual Convention, every Region Conference, every Chapter meeting, some AIA Conventions and online webinars over each 3-year period, I assumed I had more than enough credits to renew.

This year the renewal notice directed me to a CSI "portal" (<https://portal.csinet.org/default.aspx>) where I am supposed to log in and complete the "Application for Certification Renewal" online. New this year is the requirement to upload information on my Professional Development Hours (PDHs), including Activity Name, Hours and Dates Earned, and Certification(s) to which they apply. I am also encouraged to upload a copy of the actual certificate I received for each Activity. Since I never had to do this before, I had never requested a certificate for each Activity attended. Hopefully, the presenters uploaded all my credit hours to the AIA database.

Available at the online portal is a downloadable 26-page *CSI Certification Renewal Instructions" guide*. It covers all possible conditions and FAQs. Fortunately, I have a month to gather my data and complete the process. *To be continued...*
